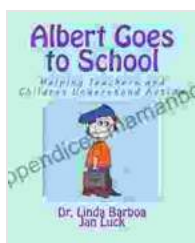

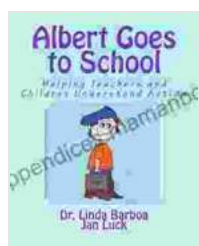
Activities for Children

- Play games that help children learn about school. Some good choices include: School Days Bingo, School Supply Scavenger Hunt, and Simon Says School Edition.

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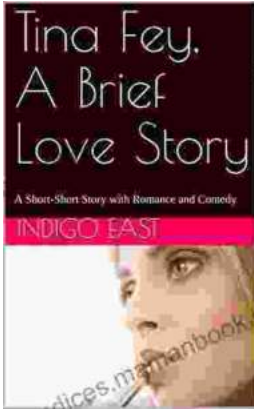
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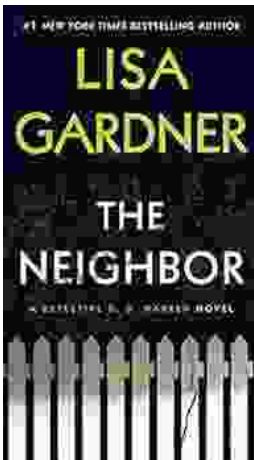
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
