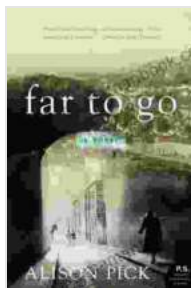


Far To Go: A Journey of Self-Discovery and Redemption

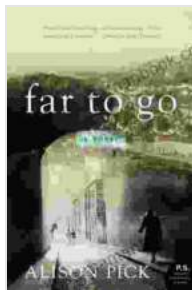

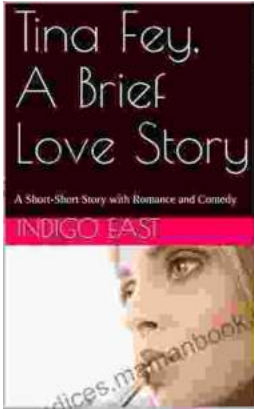

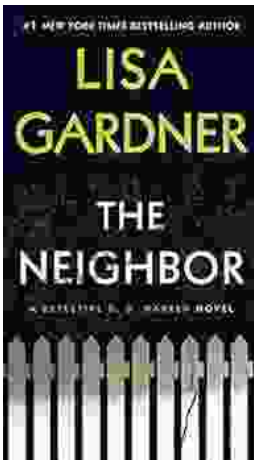
