- 1. Sc 11: Sc 11 stitches evenly across the first row of the toe.
- 2. Sc in each stitch across: Sc in each of the remaining stitches across the row. You should have a total of 22 stitches.
- 3. **Turn your work:** Ch 1 and turn your work.
- 4. Sc in the first 2 stitches: Sc in the first two stitches of the row.
- 5. Sc 2 together, sc 1: Insert your hook into the next two stitches and sc together (decrease). Sc in the next stitch.
- 6. **Repeat the previous two steps:** Continue alternating sc 2 together and sc 1 across the row. You should end with 11 stitches.
- 7. Repeat rows 3-6: Repeat rows 3-6 until you have only 1 stitch remaining.
- 8. Cut the yarn and pull through the last stitch: Cut the yarn, leaving a tail, and pull it through the last stitch to close the toe.

Part 3: Creating the Cuff

- 1. **Join the yarn to the leg:** Join a new yarn color to the leg of the stocking, near the top.
- 2. Chain 4: Chain 4 to form the foundation of your cuff.
- 3. Sc into the 2nd chain from the hook: Sc into the second chain from the hook.
- 4. **Continue sc across the chain:** Continue single crocheting into each remaining chain across the row. You should have a total of 3 single crochet stitches.
- 5. **Turn your work:** Chain 1 to turn your work at the end of the row.
- 6. Sc in each stitch across: Sc in each of the remaining stitches across the row. You should have 3 sc stitches.
- Repeat rows 5-6: Repeat rows 5-6 until the cuff reaches your desired width. For a medium-sized stocking, you will need approximately 10-15 rows.
- 8. Cut the yarn and pull through the last stitch: Cut the yarn, leaving a tail, and pull it through the last stitch to close the cuff.

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
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
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
