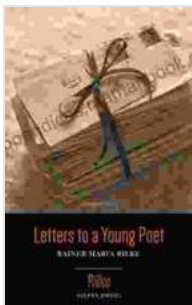


Letters to Young Poets: A Timeless Guide to the Art of Poetry

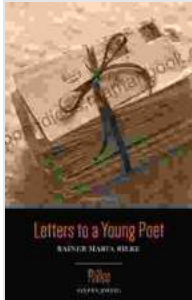
The Challenges and Rewards of a Life Dedicated to Art

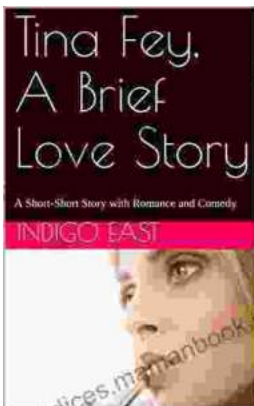

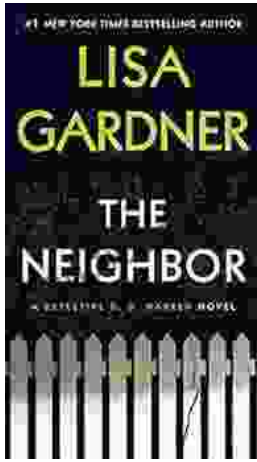
